Power of God's Word Nehemiah 8

I. Hearing God's Word – 8:1-8

- There was a hunger for God's Word 1
 People gathered united asking for God's Word
 Perhaps stirred by what they saw God do
 Protected them from their enemies
 Enabled them to build the wall in 52 days
 Asked Ezra to read God's Law to them
 They did not have individual copies of Scripture
- Ezra brought the Law to them 2
 Men, women & all old enough to understand Note there was a sense of urgency
 1st day of seventh month – note 7:23
- They listened attentively 3
 Ezra read from early morning until midday
- 4. People stood as God's Word was read 5 Sense of respect as they listened
- 5. They worshipped the God of the Book 6
 Ezra led, blessed the Lord, the great God
 People responded "Amen, Amen"
 With lifted hands toward the God of His Word
 People bowed worshipped with faces to ground
- Provision made to help understanding 7-8 Levites scattered among the people To make sure people understood what they heard

II. Hearts Stirred by God's Word – 9-12

- 1. All wept as they heard God's Law 9 Perhaps under a sense of conviction
- Nehemiah & Ezra comforted them 9-10 Don't weep, this day is holy to the Lord It is a day to turn mourning into great joy When hearts are touched as we hear God's Word
- 3. Became day of feasting & rejoicing 10-12 People feasted together with great joy Sent portions to those who needed – share joy All in response to what they had heard

III. Obeying God's Word – 13-18

- Obedience begins promptly 13
 2nd day of 7th month leaders gathered with Ezra To study the words of the Law
- 2. Discovered time for Feast of Booths 14 Feast to remember how Israel lived in wilderness
- 3. Proclaimed this feast to the people 15 Told them how to build these shelters
- 4. People responded in building booths 16 They lived in these shelters for that week
- 5. They rejoiced in keeping this Feast 17 Feast not kept this way since days of Joshua It was a time of great rejoicing
- Ezra read from the law each day 18 Did it for 7 days – 8th day a solemn assembly
