## God's Glorious Victory Esther 9-10

## I. Victory Over the Enemy – 9:1-19

- "D" Day arrives 9:1
   13<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> month Day set by Haman's decree to kill Jews But God turned it around – 2<sup>nd</sup> decree Jews gained mastery over those who hated them
- Jews gathered to defend themselves 2
   In cities throughout 127 provinces of empire
   They won great victories people feared them
- 3. Leaders in provinces helped the Jews 3-4 "Fear of Mordecai had fallen on them" Mordecai was great in the king's palace And his power was growing in the empire
- 4. Jews won great victories 5-10
  In Susa they killed 500 men
  Also killed the 10 sons of Haman
  But they did not take plunder of those killed
- 5. King & Esther get reports 11-15
  King tells her of 500 killed in Susa
  And the death of Haman's 10 sons
  He asks if she has further request
  Esther asks for a second day in Susa 13
  And for Haman's sons to be hanged on gallows
  King grants her request 14-15
- 6. Victory reported in Empire 16 In defense Jews killed 75,000 enemies Again they did not take the plunder
- 7. Jews celebrated their victories 17-19
  On 14<sup>th</sup> of the month they celebrated 17
  Day of feasting & gladness in the empire
  Celebrated on 15<sup>th</sup> in city of Susa 18-19

## II. Feast of Purim – 9:20-32

- Mordecai orders annual feast 20-22 Sent a letter to all Jews in empire – 20-21 Requiring them to set 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> for feasting Remembering God's glorious victory – 22 Days when they got relief from enemies Month turned from sorrow to gladness From mourning into a holiday Make them days of feasting with family, friends Time for giving gifts to the poor
- Name of feast is Purim 23-26
   Taken from Haman casting lots (Pur)
   To select date to kill all Jews in the empire
- 3. Jews committed to obey 27-28 This feast continues to this day
- Esther & Mordecai sent 2<sup>nd</sup> letter 29-30 Letter was official establishment of Purim Giving directions how feast is to be celebrated

## III. God's Man in Power – 10:1-3

- Ahasuerus continued as king 1-2 He imposed taxes on his empire He promoted Mordecai to 2<sup>nd</sup> in kingdom All is recorded in Persian Chronicles
- Mordecai ruled under him 2-3
   With authority he sought Jews welfare He was a blessing & sought peace for Jews
