The King's Glory Matthew 17

- I. Revelation of His Glory 17:1-13
- 1. Promised to some disciples 16:28 Glory of the Kingdom is in the King
- Seen by inner three 17:1
 Six days later (after the promise)
 Peter, James and John on mountain
- 3. His glory is intrinsic 2
 His glory was veiled in human flesh
 It now radiates from within ("metamorphosed")
 Face shone as the sun
 Raiment was white as the light
- 4. His glory is incomparable 3-5 Moses and Elijah appear with Him Talked with Jesus about His death – Lk 9:30-31 Peter in awe with these three Moses – Deliverer & lawgiver Elijah – Great prophet Jesus – Messiah & King Would erect a monument to honor the 3 Father spoke from heaven in response My beloved Son – Hear Him
- 5. Response of disciples 6
 Fell on their face and were sore afraid
 They had seen the glory of God in Jesus
 They had heard the voice of God from heaven
- 6. Jesus ministers to the three 7-8 He touched them & calmed their fear They refocused on Jesus only
- Told not to relate vision to anyone 9 Until after He rose from the dead
- 8. He answered their question 10-13
 About the coming of Elijah 10
 Could be fulfilled in John the Baptist 11-13

II. Relevance of His Glory – 17:14-21

- Seen in meeting human need Man brings demon-possessed son – 14-15 Seems to be an extreme case
- 2. Disciples could not help him 16
- 3. Jesus rebukes their lack of faith 17
- 4. He casts out the demon 18
- 5. Jesus responds to disciples' failure 19-21 It is a lack of faith – Not the amount of faith Lack also of prayer and fasting

III. Redemption Glory – 17:22-23

1. Redemption is the focus of His mission He came to provide salvation for man This is accomplished in His death & resurrection Fullness of His glory is seen in His sacrifice

- 2. His suffering includes betrayal Someone close to Him will turn against Him
- 3. This caused sorrow for His disciples They don't want to think about this
- 4. His glory is seen in His resurrection Father's acceptance of His redemptive work

IV. Recognizing His Glory – 17:24-27

- Implication of Peter's question 24-25 He had seen His glory on the mountain Did He understand its significance Note his response to question on tribute tax
- 2. Jesus' response to Peter 25-26 Kings don't pay tribute nor do their children If He is the Son of God should He pay
- Yet He will not give offense 27
 As man He will submit to human authority Provided for Himself & Peter in the fish
