Responding to God's Call Exodus 2:11-4:17

I. A Human Response 2:11-15

- Moses tries to help his people 11-14
 When he was grown, age 40 Acts 7:23
 Compassion for their burdens 11
 Saw a slave-master beating a Hebrew 11
 He killed the Egyptian slave-master 12
 Made sure no one was looking
 Hid the body in the sand
 Misunderstood by his people 13-14
 Next day tried to separate two Hebrews fighting
 "who made you a prince and judge over us"
 "will you kill me as you killed the Egyptian"
 Moses knew what he did was known 14
 (Acts 7:23-28)
- 2. Pharaoh's anger causes him to flee 15
 Threatened by death he went to land of Midian
- 3. His attempt seemed to be a failure Humanly speaking, even with his people
- 4. How did God view this? An act of faith – Hebrews 11:24-26 He chose to stand with his persecuted people To suffer affliction with them Rather than enjoy pleasures of sin in the palace Looking forward to an eternal reward By faith he fled Egypt – Heb. 11:27

II. Deliverer in Exile - 2:16-25

- Exile in Midian for next 40 yrs 16-22
 Helped some shepherd girls -16-17
 Continued to do good where he was
 Offered a place to live by Reuel 16-21
 Girls told their father what had happened
- 2. Marries Zipporah & has a son 21-22 She is the daughter of Reuel Firstborn son is Gershom
- 3. Pharaoh died & Jews cried to God 23
 Way is prepared for the Deliverer to return
 People turn to God in their affliction
- 4. God heard their cries 24-25 He heard their cries, had compassion

III. God's Call to Moses - Ex. 3

Meets God at Burning Bush - 1-6
 Shepherding sheep for father-in-law - 1
 At Mt. Horeb, the Mount of God
 Glory of God appeared in burning bush - 2
 Angel of the Lord in a flame of fire
 Yet the bush was not consumed
 Moses attracted to this unusual sight - 3
 God spoke to Moses from the bush - 4-6
 Moses is in presence of the Holy God - 5
 Covenant God of Abraham, Isaac & Jacob - 6
 Moses in awe before presence of the Holy God

- God will Deliver His People 7-9
 God saw their need and heard their cry 7
 God will intervene on behalf of His people 8
 He will bring them out of Egypt in deliverance
 He will bring them into a land of milk and honey
 God has seen the Egyptian oppression 9
- 3. God will use Moses as deliverer 10-13

 Moses questions his qualifications 11

 God assures him of success 12

 Your people will serve God on this mountain

 Moses lacks knowledge of God 13
- 4. God reveals Himself as great I AM 14-5
 He is the eternal self-existing God
 He is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob
 He is unchanging God, faithful to His covenants
- 5. Directives from God 16-22 Gather elders of Israel together - 16-18 Tell them about your encounter with God Tell them about God's promised deliverance They will listen and respond to your leadership Go to Pharaoh & request release - 18-20 Request a 3 day period to go worship God - 18 Pharaoh will not give you permission to go - 19 God will do miracles to make Pharaoh agree -

Gather material wealth from Egyptians – 21-22 God will give people favor with the Egyptians They will give the Israelites wealth God's people will not go away empty

IV. Moses' Objections - 4:1-17

- "They will not believe me" 1-9
 Note what God said in 3:18
 God's mighty power will convince them
 Turning his rod into a serpent 2-5
 A leprous hand made well again 6-8
 Turning water into blood 9
- 2. "I am not a gifted speaker" 10-12
 God will speak through Moses 11-12
- "Send someone else" 13
 God is angry but will let Aaron speak 14-17
 God will speak to Moses & Moses to Aaron
