The Battle Begins Exodus 5:1-7:13

I. Pharaoh's Resistance – 5:1-18

- Moses requests Israel's release 1
 Request made in the name of Jehovah
- Pharaoh rejects Moses' request 2-3
 Who is your God that I should listen to him?
 Moses repeats the request, it is denied
- 3. Pharaoh retaliates against Israel 4-18
 Accuses them of idleness 4-5
 Makes them gather their own straw 6-7
 Requires the same amount of bricks 8-9
 Beaten when they fail to meet quotas 10-18
 God sometimes allows things to get worse

II. Israel's Reaction - 5:19-23

- 1. Leaders complain to Moses 19-21
 Blame him for their increased burdens
- 2. Moses voices complaint to God 22-23
 Why are you bringing evil on this people?
 Why have you sent me to deliver them?
 Things have only gotten worse
 You have done nothing to deliver them

III. God's Reassurance - 6:1-12

- 1. God's resolve is stated 1-8
 I am Jehovah God of the patriarchs 1-3
 I established my covenant with them 4
 I have heard your groaning 5
 I will bring out of bondage & redeem you 6
 I will make you my people & be your God 7
 I will bring you into the land of promise 8
- 2. Moses' reluctance after failure 9-12
 People did not listen to Moses anymore
 Moses did not want to go to Pharaoh
 What's the use, he will not listen to me

IV. God's Commitment to Israel - 6:13-7:5

- His Purpose: is unchanged 6:13
 He will deliver His people from bondage
- 2. His People; need deliverance 6:14-15
 The tribes of Israel need deliverance
- 3. His Plan: use Moses and Aaron 6:16-30 Their family lineage is traced 16-27 God's commission is renewed 28-29 Moses is still unconvinced 30
- 4. His Power; will enable you 7:1-5 Don't be deterred by hardness of heart God will use rejection to display His power God will convince Egyptians that He is God

V. God's Power Revealed - 7:6-13

Display of power required
 Moses is still unconvinced – 6:30
 Moses & Aaron are old – 7:7

Human ability is not sufficient

2. This is spiritual warfare – 7:8-13

Pharaoh did not accept God's authority – 8-9

He needed to see God's mighty power

Egypt's gods duplicated first miracles – 10-12

Two supernatural forces in conflict

God's supremacy must be proven

Pharaoh's heart hardened against God -13

Egyptians were ripe for judgment

Continued to mistreat Israelites

Israel needed to see God's mighty power
