The Qualified Savior Luke 4:1-44

I. Approved in Testing – 4:1-13

- 1. Jesus is approved by God 3:21-22 At His baptism Holy Spirit descended on Him God said that He was well pleased
- Led by the Spirit to the wilderness 4:1-2 Adam failed the test under ideal conditions Jesus is tested under most stressful conditions He is in the wilderness for 40 days Satan has access to Him to tempt Him He had nothing to eat for 40 days – He is hungry Will He respond to Satan or follow God's Word?
- Test one You can meet your needs 3
 As the Son of God you have power to act
 You can turn these stones into bread
- 4. Jesus' response 4
 Quote from Deuteronomy 8:3
 Trusting God to provide is more important than acting against His Word or out of His will
- 5. Test two a short cut to your goal 5-7 Satan offers Him the kingdoms of this world Satan is the god of this world – 2 Cor. 4:4 He can turn this over to Jesus right at this point Jesus just needs to bow in worship to Satan
- 6. Jesus' response to test two 8 Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 10:20 As he turns from Satan, He will worship God Worship belongs to God and God alone
- 7. Test three Test God's promises 9-11 As God's Son He will protect you if you jump Satan supports this with Psalm 91:11-12
- 8. Jesus' response to this test 12 Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:16 We are to trust God not see if He will respond
- Satan ends tests having failed 13
 Does not mean there could be later tests
 But Jesus is proven to qualify as our Savior

II. Proven in Ministry – 4:14-30

- Pattern of His ministry 14-15
 Ministers in the power of the Holy Spirit – 14
 Consistently wherever He went
 He taught in their synagogues – 15
 He worked within the Jewish order
 People responded to His ministry
- Example of His ministry 16-21
 In His home synagogue at Nazareth 16
 He read from the Scriptures Isaiah 17-19
 Isaiah spoke of Messiah's ministry
 He declared fulfillment of this prophecy 20-21
- Response to His ministry 22
 People were amazed at His gracious words
 But they were troubled because they knew Him
 He was just the carpenter's son

- 4. Jesus notes their unbelief 23-27 They will not believe without miracles - 23 Do what we heard you did in other places Prophets are often rejected at home – 24-27 God did miracles for believing Gentiles in O.T. Widow in Sidon during famine – 24-26 Leper from Syria – Naaman – 27
 5. People respond in anger – 28-30
- People respond in anger 28-30
 Anger perhaps because of Gentile reference
 They put Him out of the city
 They tried to throw Him off the cliff
 He escaped from them
 "Passed through the midst of them" a miracle?

III. Power in Ministry – 4:31-44

- 1. Continued His teaching ministry 31-32 Taught in synagogue at Capernaum They saw power in His words
- Ministry was proven with signs 33-41
 Cast out demons in man in synagogue 33-35
 Demons knew who He was 34
 Jesus could not accept their testimony 35
 He cast them out of the man
 People amazed at His power over demons 36
 His fame spread around the country 37
 Healed the sick and cast out demons 38-41
 Peter's Mother-in-law 38-39
 Many others of various diseases 40
 Cast our others' demon-possessed 41
- 3. Moved on to other places 42-44 People did not want Him to leave But His mission must continue
