A Prayer for All Believers Ephesians 1:15-23

I. Pattern for Prayer 1:15-17

- 1. Prompted by what he heard 15 (Wherefore) He heard of their faith in the Lord Jesus He heard of their love for all the saints
- 2. Praise and Petition 16 Continually gave thanks to God for them Continually prayed for them
- 3. Person to whom he prays 17
 The God of our Lord Jesus Christ (cp. v. 3)
 Our approach to God rests upon our relationship to Christ
 The Father of Glory

Focus of our prayer is for His glory

II. Petition of Prayer 1:17, 18

God would give spiritual understanding – 17-18

 So they would grow in knowledge of Him God's revelation is aimed at helping us to better know Him

As knowledge of God grows, life & perspective changes

2. So they would know the hope of His calling To better understand their calling, what God's call implies

To see more clearly our hope in Christ Great hope is what gets us through difficulties of this life

3. So they might know the riches of His inheritance To grasp the fullness of God's plan and purpose for us

To better understand the riches we have in Christ

III. Power in Prayer - 1:19-22

That we might realize fullness of God's power

- 1. Greatness of God's power available to us 19
- 2. Same power that raised Jesus from dead 20
- Power great enough to conquer sin, death and hell 3. Same power that exalted Jesus over all - 20-22
- Over all that is in Heaven seated at God's right hand

Over every principality & power – all authorities Right now in this world and in the future All things are under His feet – 22

4. We approach with confidence in His name

IV. Jesus Christ is Head of the Church – 1:22-23

- 1. God has given Him authority over the Church It is Christ's church He has purchased it with His own blood
- 2. He is the Head of the church

As head all decisions are to be made by Him

3. The Church is His body

The body carries out all that He desires Think of this analogy & the disorder when it does not work

Will of the head is hindered if the body doesn't work
