

10/24: John 16:4b-15

In this passage, Jesus again speaks about leaving the disciples, but that he will leave the Holy Spirit with them.

What was the focus of the disciples' questions in previous chapters when they asked where Jesus was going? Were they concerned for lesus or for themselves?

What does Jesus' loving rebuke of the disciples in John 16:5-6 teaches us about perspective in pain?

In what ways are you most tempted to miss the good things Christ promises because you are distracted by the bad things happening in or around your life?

Read Romans 8:16 aloud.

What does the Spirit do according to Romans 8:16? Why is the ministry of the Holy Spirit vital in everyday Christian life no matter the circumstances we face?

Father, help me be a worker who works with: HUMILITY

Read Proverbs 10:8

Pray for your relationship with your boss, your parents, your teachers, coaches – or anyone with authority over you. Ask God to give you a spirit of willing submission that humbly "accepts commands," even when you don't like them. Confess times when you've been a "chattering fool." Pray that you would speak to and about your coworkers, siblings, spouse, classmates or teammates with grace and self-control.

John 16:4b-15 (ESV)

"I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵ But now I am going to him who sent me, and none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶ But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. ⁷ Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸ And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰ concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; ¹¹ concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

¹² "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³ When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵ All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.
