Confronted with Deception Joshua 9:1-10:15

I. Alliance with Gibeonites - 9

Enemies begin to unite – 9:1-2
 News of Israel's victories became known
 Kings on west side of Jordan gather to fight
 From hill country of central Palestine
 From western foothills (valleys)
 From Mediterranean coastal plain to Lebanon

2. Deception of Gibeonites - 3-13
People of Gibeon chose another path – 3-5
They sought to make an alliance of peace
Alliances forbidden by God - Deut. 20:10-18
Decieve with clothes, food supplies, shoes – 4-5
Gibeon pretends to be a city "far off" - 6-9
Reason for their deception – 10-11
They heard what God had done for Israel
On the other side of the Jordan
Evidence to support deception – 12-13
Look at our clothes, food supplies, shoes

- Decision of Joshua & Leaders 14-15
 Based on physical evidence
 Did not ask for God's direction
 Joshua & leaders made a treaty with them
- 4. Dilemma facing Israel 16-27 3 days later deception was known – 16-17 They were neighbors – cities in Canaan Gibeon, Chephirah, Beeroth & Kirjath-jearim Honor the treaty or destroy the people – 18-20 Leaders of Israel chose not to kill them Although people murmured against the decision

Leaders feared God's wrath – 20 Considered their oath to be sacred before God Consider what God said in Psalm15:4

5. Dealing with their dilemma – 21-27
Let them live but make them servants – 21
Cutting wood & carrying water for them
Joshua confronted their deception – 22-23
Held them guilty for their deception - 22
Told them of the consequences – 23
They were cursed & would serve as slaves
They would cut wood & carry water for God's house

They accepted the sentence – 24-27
Recognized that God had given them the land
He commanded Israel to destroy all inhabitants
We were afraid for our lives
So they served the congregation & God's altar

II. Defense of Gibeonites - 10:1-15

Plan of the Enemy - 1-5
 King of Israel heard of Joshua's victories - 1
 He had taken Ai & utterly destroyed it
 As he had done to Jericho & her king
 Heard Gibeon made peace with Israel – 1-2

Feared because Gibeon was a royal city It was greater than Ai

Five kings consolidate their forces – 3-5
King of Jerusalem contacts 4 other kings – 3
Kings of Hebron, Jarmuth, Lachish & Eglon
Calls them to attack Gibeon for joining Israel - 4
Lesson for any city making peace with Israel
So these 5 kings attack Gibeon

- 2. Plea of Gibeon to Israel 6
 Come quickly, help us against these kings
- Response of Joshua 7
 Opportunity to delay or do nothing Joshua & Israel honor their commitment
- 4. God promised victory for Israel 8
 None of them will stand against Israel
- God fought for Israel 9-15
 Provided ammunition from heaven 10-11
 More died with God's hailstones then Israel's swords

Extended daylight for full victory - 12-14 God's mighty power was displayed Joshua & the army went back to Gilgal - 15 s people
